This Plan is aligned with national policy in Ireland and international frameworks, notably Better Outcomes Brighter Futures; Children First 2015; Making Great Art Work 2016-2025; UN Convention on the Rights of the Child; National Framework for Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making.

Waterford Youth Arts has always engaged with stakeholders to evaluate the impact of our work and develop future actions. The development of this Strategic Plan was no different. It has been informed through consultation with our stakeholders, during facilitated process by а Sarah Bates Evoy in 2018-19, supported by SICAP Waterford Area Partnership. This process helped to lay the groundwork for the organisation to identify priorities for the future. The Board and staff then engaged in a planning process with a consultant Glynis Currie in 2021 - 2022 and Strategic Plan 2023-2027 was completed along with the development of other supplementary documents.
